Dear CBHA Residents:

We are certainly blessed to live in this community, along with its affordability and services. Most residences have "closed septic systems" where the closed tank is pumped once or twice a month into CBHA trucks and then emptied into a large tank from which the septage can be stored or processed.

This has worked well for many years, however with more full-time residents moving into the area, we are approaching what will become, eventually "critical mass". Simply put, your board will need to do some strategic planning on what needs to be done over the long haul. It is not as simple as storing the septage forever.

Along with that there are some considerations on the part of the homeowner. First the septic tanks, while emptied, will eventually build up solids that need to be removed. The office can advise on some sources that can do this. Second, the tanks are closed, but can conduct leakage from surface and groundwater. What condition is yours in? The CBHA office can suggest resources to keep your septic system in optimal condition or advise on any issues.
