### From the Board...Annual Meeting & Community Updates

Carlyon Beach Homeowners Association's Annual Meeting is scheduled for Friday, June 14, 2025. Annual meeting packets will be available for pickup at the clubhouse beginning in mid-May. We encourage homeowners to stop by and collect their packet to help the Association save on mailing costs. Any packets not picked up will be mailed no later than May 30 to ensure compliance with RCW notice requirements.

Thank you to all the homeowners who attended our recent townhall meeting, and a special thanks to the Marina Committee for their efforts in helping make the event a success. The Board is actively reviewing the feedback received as we prepare for the busy summer season and continue our efforts to address marina repairs.

We also want to provide an update regarding the ongoing insurance claim related to marina damage. Unfortunately, the initial claim was filed under the incorrect policy and was rejected. However, we have since submitted a new claim under the correct coverage, which is now pending a report from an independent engineer. We remain hopeful that this claim will be successful and will keep the community informed as we receive updates.

Lastly, the Board would like to extend heartfelt thanks to Kiffani Iverson for her service as President of the HOA. Her leadership and dedication to Carlyon Beach have made a lasting impact, and she will be missed as she begins her next chapter on the East Coast. In accordance with the Bylaws, the Board will appoint the next highest vote-getter from the upcoming annual election to fill the vacancy in the coming weeks.

### Marina Slips and Kayak Rack Lease Packets

Annual boat slip and kayak rack lease renewal packets will be emailed out shortly. Current leases are not on-going and must be renewed each year.

- Completed packets must be returned to the CBHOA office by May 30, 2025.
- In order to lease a boat slip or kayak rack, members remain in good standing.
- For boat slips, current vessel registration and proof of insurance is required with the signed lease.

#### **Events Committee**

The Architecture Committee has been meeting the  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  week of the month and has several project reviews. Any questions can be directed to the office

#### Water Committee

Well 3 went online 4/17/25. The Water System Plan is still in process. Stay tuned.

We're thrilled to update you on our Meter Read Pilot program, which began on March 27th, 2025. Our team has worked 114 hours, walked 5 miles, and read over 200 water meters, creating a detailed database to track water usage and identify maintenance needs. The program is progressing smoothly, hitting all planned milestones.

In collaboration with FutureClear, we're building a precise map of our water and wastewater systems using Geographic Information System (GIS) technology. This map will pinpoint meters, pipes, and valves with high accuracy, helping us respond to emergencies quickly, streamline maintenance, and lower costs for reliable service.

The future program goals will empower our community with fairer billing through accurate water usage tracking, helping you avoid surprise fees and budget better. It also promotes water conservation by reducing waste and supports our wastewater treatment systems by catching leaks early, ensuring smooth and sustainable services.

#### Marina Committee

#### Key Points from the Town Hall:

#### • Dock Repairs Timeline:

Work on A Dock will begin after the community comment period ends on **May 5th, 2025**. The final permitting process may take several weeks. **Volunteers will be needed** to help remove the damaged dock. This will save the community approximately **\$40,000** in labor costs.

#### Dock Sharing & Access:

Due to limited space during the repair period, dock sharing will be necessary. We ask for everyone's cooperation to ensure marina access for all members. Per CBHA policy, holders of two leased slips will need to share their extra slip during the repair period. Once repairs are complete, slips will return to their original lessees, with annual renewals continuing in July.

#### Repair Goals:

While we hope to be fully operational by **July**, please note this is not guaranteed.

#### Insurance Update & Budget:

Insurance coverage has been confirmed and is under review for a possible loss settlement. In the meantime, we are making careful repair decisions. So far, \$331,000 has been used from the 2024–2025 fiscal budget. To stay fiscally responsible, repairs will proceed in phases.

#### Phase 1 Details:

The first phase includes adding **38 slips to A Dock** and **upgrading the electrical system** for improved lighting and compliance with marina regulations. The new docks are also designed to prevent Sea Lions from boarding.

#### Looking Ahead:

Once the insurance settlement is finalized, we can plan for additional fingers on A Dock and explore further improvements. The CBHA Board continues to work on the community budget and will share more details in the upcoming Annual Report.
